# How Can I Get Reimbursed for Septic System Inspection, Pumping, or Repair?

Follow These Steps:

**Step 1:** Go to PoopSmartClark.org!

**Step 2:** Check to see if you live in the Poop Smart Clark project area.

**Step 3:** Fill out the Program Sign-Up Form.

Step 4: Wait to receive an email to find out if you are eligible for reimbursement.

Get up to \$1,130 in reimbursement for septic inspection, pumping, or minor repairs



Get up to \$20,000 in reimbursement for major septic repairs or replacement

**Step 5:** Get your septic system inspected, pumped, and/or repaired.

**Step 5:** Provide your tax return information to verify your financial eligibility. \*

**Step 6:** Submit receipts to the Septic Reimbursement Form on PoopSmartClark.org.

**Step 6:** Get notified if you were selected to receive financial assistance.

**Step 7:** Receive a check in the mail within 30 days!

**Step 7:** Participate in a site visit to verify your application information.

**Step 8:** Review project details and sign the contract when you're ready.
